**AGREEMENT OF CONSERVATOR OF THE PERSON**

As conservator of the person, I acknowledge the following responsibilities and agree to:

- Read and be guided by the Standards of Practice adopted by the Office of the Probate Court Administrator in carrying out my duties as conservator of the person. I understand the Standards of Practice are available online at [www.ctprobate.gov](http://www.ctprobate.gov) or from the court.
- Use the least restrictive means of intervention necessary to meet the needs of the person under conservatorship.
- Submit a Conservator's Report, PC-371, every year to report on the condition of the person under conservatorship.
- After the first year of an involuntary conservatorship and every three years thereafter, obtain and file in court a physician's evaluation of the conserved person for the purpose of a court review to determine whether the conservatorship should be continued, modified or terminated.
- File a Conservator's Report and Petition for Placement in an Institution of Long-Term Care, PC-371A, prior to placing the person under conservatorship in an institution of long-term care. If the placement is the result of a discharge from a hospital, I understand that I must file the report and petition within five days of the placement.
- Seek Probate Court approval prior to the change of residence, sale of real property or household furnishings, termination of a lease of the person under conservatorship by filing a PC-303, Petition to Terminate Tenancy or Lease, Change of Residence or Dispose of Household Furnishings of the Person under Conservatorship.
- Immediately determine whether the person under conservatorship owns or has access to firearms or ammunition and take immediate steps to secure them, unless the court has specifically assigned this obligation to another conservator.
- Notify the court of any change of address of the person under conservatorship, my address, or the address of other parties interested in the conservatorship. I will also immediately notify the court if the person under conservatorship dies.

- Continue to educate myself regarding the role and responsibilities of a conservator of the person. I understand that there is online training for conservators available at [ctprobate.gov](http://ctprobate.gov), in which I am encouraged to enroll.
- I understand that failure to comply with these conditions may result in a court hearing to determine whether or not I may continue as conservator.
